Course Objectives

This one-day course is designed to provide pragmatic clinical information about a variety of issues pertinent to the practicing anesthesiologist. The faculty will present lectures relevant to diverse areas of clinical practice. The lectures will be presented in a manner conducive to interactive participation. There will be ample time for questions and discussion. At the conclusion of the course, attendees should be able to:

- Appreciate the importance of developing preoperative beta-blocker guidelines
- Manage anesthetic challenges outside the operating room
- Recognize and manage intraoperative crisis
- Prevent and manage complications associated with regional anesthesia
- Develop strategies to treat acute pain in the opioid tolerant patient
- Apply strategies to care for patients with cancer pain
- Implement effective anesthetic management of the neurotrauma patient
- Understand appropriate transfusion triggers and targets
- Appreciate new technologies for airway management
- Manage the obstetric patient for non-obstetric surgery
- Manage patients with latex allergy in the perioperative period
- Understand the basis for recent controversies in pediatric anesthesia
